Then as time goes on as they get into the game, there's the question if they want their characters to be in a relationship with another writer's character or create an NPC to avoid the open a dialogue with someone because of that awkward conversation and the possibility of being harrassed. Which can be seen differently from someone else who feels they're being genuine and not at all disrespectful.

Either way, there's a history of issues that have led to people feeling ways that are valid.

Rules: Use common sense. Be respectful to one another.
